SERVICE SPOTLIGHT: ORAL CANCER SCREENING

At Hammerlee Dental Care we seek to provide you access to the newest and most effective scientific screening and treatment. Recently the Identafi® system was introduced. This device greatly enhances our ability to find early signs of cancer and dysplasia in the mouth. Historically, our practice has used white light in examination for oral cancer. The use of narrow band violet light and green-amber reflected light helps us detect in the

oral tissue. Early detection of oral cancer is important to being able to provide early treatment and avoidance of the problems which arise from late stage detection of oral cancer. We encourage you to discuss with us your questions related to detection of oral cancer. The Oral Cancer Foundation advises that one American dies every hour from oral cancer. Late detection is the primary cause that both the incidence and mortality rates of oral

cancer continue to increase. As with most cancers, age is the primary risk factor for oral cancer. Tobacco and alcohol use are other major predisposing risk factors but more than 25% of oral cancer victims have no such lifestyle risk factors. Recently scientists have established a connection between HPV viral infection in the mouth and the occurrence of oral cancer. It is important for everyone to be screened for oral cancer once per year.

CHILDREN’S DENTAL HEALTH: FLOSSING WITH BRACES

It used to be quite a chore to floss teeth with braces on. It involved threading floss through a floss threader and maneuvering it between the teeth and the archwire. The process probably isn’t something your child is excited to do every day, but excellent oral hygiene is crucial while orthodontic work is being done.

A revolutionary, yet simple,

tool has changed all of that! Here at Hammerlee Dental Care, we are supplying our orthodontic patients with a flosser called the Platypus, so they can floss quickly and easily and even on the go.

The Platypus consists of a y-shaped piece of plastic with a floss thread connecting the two points of the plastic holder. The one side is shaped like a Platypus bill,

similar to a spatula, which allows the product to slide under the archwire. At the opposite end of the flosser is a small brush that can be used to clean around brackets.

Many orthodontic patients (and their parents!) find this to be an easier way to floss during orthodontic treatment and the Platypus helps them maintain better oral health.

Does your child have braces? If so, ask your hygienist about the Platypus flosser at your next visit with us.

PREVENTION IS THE KEY: SENSITIVE TEETH

Is the taste of ice cream or a sip of hot coffee sometimes a painful experience for you? Does brushing or flossing make you wince occasionally?

If so, you may have sensitive teeth. Possible causes include:

- Tooth decay (cavities)
- Fractured teeth
- Worn fillings
- Gum disease
- Worn tooth enamel
- Exposed tooth root

In healthy teeth, a layer of enamel protects the crowns of your teeth—the part above the gum line. Under the gum line a layer called cementum protects the tooth root. Underneath both the enamel and the cementum is dentin. Dentin is less dense than enamel and cementum and contains microscopic tubules (small hollow tubes or ca-

nals). When dentin loses its protective covering of enamel or cementum these tubules allow heat and cold or acidic or sticky foods to reach the nerves and cells inside the tooth. Dentin may also be exposed when gums recede. The result can be hypersensitivity.

Sensitive teeth can be treated. The type of treatment will depend on what is causing the sensitivity. Your dentist may suggest one of a variety of treatments:

Desensitizing toothpaste. This contains compounds that help block transmission of sensation from the tooth surface to the nerve, and usually requires several applications before the sensitivity is reduced.

Fluoride gel. An in-office technique which strengthens tooth enamel and reduces

the transmission of sensations.

A crown, inlay or bonding. These may be used to correct a flaw or decay that results in sensitivity.

Surgical gum graft. If gum tissue has been lost from the root, this will protect the root and reduce sensitivity.

Root canal. If sensitivity is severe and persistent and cannot be treated by other means, your dentist may recommend this treatment to eliminate the problem.

Proper oral hygiene is the key to preventing sensitive-tooth pain. Ask your dentist if you have any questions about your daily oral hygiene routine or concerns about tooth sensitivity.†
